Explain details from the story in addition to how the book affected you.</p>	<p>Pretend you are a librarian reviewing this story. Write at least 9 sentences describing why you would or would not recommend reading this story to someone.</p>

Are they a bad or good person? Why? Give examples of each.</p>

Give five reasons in paragraph form for your choice of words.</p>	<p>If you could buy a gift for one of the main characters what would you purchase? Give at least three reasons why you would choose this character. Use the text to support your answers.</p>

Describe in detail things about the book that are interesting using examples from the book itself.</p>	<p>Create a new character to either replace a character already in the book or to add to the list of characters already in the book. Describe the physical appearance and personality of the character. Include details how and why they would be a good fit into the book.</p>	<p>Sometimes authors tell about the feelings of their story characters. You can tell how the story characters feel by the way they act in the story - very happy, excited, sad, worried, puzzled, pleased, or disappointed. Choose a feeling of one of the characters, describe the feeling and tell what caused the character to have that strong feeling.</p>
